

ORDINANCE NO. 41

An Ordinance to prohibit the consumption of alcoholic beverages on or upon the public streets, walks and parks of Leonardtown.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Leonardtown desire to preserve and promote the health, safety and well being of the inhabitants of the Town of Leonardtown and to protect their property, safety and well being, the following ordinance is passed and adopted by the Commissioners of Leonardtown:

1. For the purpose of this article the term "alcoholic beverages" is defined to mean: alcohol, brandy, whiskey, rum, gin, cordial, beer, ale, porter, stout, wine, cider, and any other spirituous, vinous, malt or fermented liquor, liquid, or compound, by whatever name called, containing one half of one per centum or more of alcohol by volume, which is fit for beverage purposes.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to drink an alcoholic beverage, or offer a drink of such to another, whether accepted or not, upon any street, avenue, alley, park, or any public place within the limits of the Town of Leonardtown, except on premises for which an "On Sale" license for the sale of alcoholic beverages shall have been issued.


3. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars. Any such violation shall constitute a separate offense on each occasion committed.


4. Be it further enacted and ordained by the Commissioners of Leonardtown that this Ordinance is deemed an emergency ordinance within the meaning of same as defined in Article 23B of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

5. Be it further enacted by the Commissioners of Leonardtown, that this Ordinance shall take effect on October 12, 1973.
