VOTE -- VOTE -- VOTE 2008 Leonardtown Elections Tuesday, May 6, 2008

Town Election Day will be on Tuesday, May 6, 2008, whereupon the Mayor's seat and two Council seats will be voted on. A Mayor and five-member Town Council govern Leonardtown, each serving a four-year term of office.

All elected officials of the Town of Leonardtown must reside within the incorporated limits of Leonardtown and be a registered voter of St. Mary's County. Residents interested in filing as a candidate must do so before the deadline date of Monday, April 14, 2008. Potential candidates for the 2008 elections are encouraged to contact the Town Office for additional information

To cast your ballot - Polls will be open on Tuesday, May 6th between 12:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. in the Town Office, located in the Proffitt Building on 41660 Courthouse Drive. Voters in Leonardtown elections must reside within the incorporated limits of Leonardtown, be at least 18 years of age on or before the day of the general election, and be a registered St. Mary's County voter. The voter registration deadline for Town residents is Friday, April 11, 2008. If you are not a registered voter and would like to register or update your address, contact the St. Mary's County Board of Elections at 301-475-7844 ext. 1610. Absentee ballots are available from the Town Office. The deadline to submit a completed absentee voter ballot for the Town's 2008 election is Tuesday, April 22, 2008.

Having a Leonardtown mailing address or owning property within the incorporated limits does not qualify you as an actual resident. If you would like to confirm that you actually reside within the incorporated limits of Leonardtown, or have other questions about the Town's elections, please contact the Town Office at 301-475-9791.

Attention Leonardtown Residents! 2007 Tax Returns

When completing your Maryland Income Tax return, please remember to check the "Municipality" box and write in "Leonardtown". This does not increase your taxes, but, thanks to you, it does assure that the Town will receive its share of income taxes from the State of Maryland.

Homestead Tax Credit

Leonardtown property owners should have recently received assessment notices from the State Department of Assessments and Taxation. Legislation enacted by the Maryland General Assembly in 2007 states that owners living in their homes must submit an application to be eligible for the Homestead Tax Credit. This credit limits the amount of assessment increase on which a homeowner will pay property taxes in that tax year on the one property actually used as the owner's principal residence. Your assessment notice should have included an application form.

For answers to some common questions about the credit, visit the State's website at http:// www.dat.state.ind.us/sdatweb/Homestead_app. htm. The site also provides an online application process and a toll-free number to call if you need additional information. The application and approval process is being handled by the State.

Trash Pickup and Recycling Reminders

Residential trash is collected every Tuesday and Friday. Trash is accepted in 30-gallon cans with lids, cans on wheels, or toters issued by Goode Trash Removal. To guarantee collection, trash should be set out the night before or by 6:00 a.m. on the day of pick-up. Bagged leaves set out by Town residents will also be picked up on regularly scheduled collection days, but is limited to 5 bags per household, per collection day. Town residents wishing further information on Leonardtown trash service, or to obtain a container, contact the Town Office.

The 2008 quarterly bulk trash pickup dates will be on the following Fridays: March 7th, June 6th, September 5th, and December 5th.

Residential recycling pickup of old newspapers, glass bottles, jars, metal and aluminum cans, and approved plastic bottles is made on Thursdays. To guarantee collection, your recycling tote should be set out the night before or by 6:00 a.m. the day of pick-up. Remember to make recycling a part of your daily routine. For more information on recycling or to receive a recycling tote, contact the Town Office or check our web site at Leonardtown.somd.com.

Did You Know?

In 1708, Philip Lynes, who was the Mayor of St. Mary's City, donated 50 acres of land, known as Shepherd's Old Fields located at the head on Breton Bay, to the colony to be laid out as the county seat. The town was named Seymour Town in honor of Governor John Seymour, the then Governor of Maryland, who signed an act into law that enabled the land to be laid out into a town.

In 1728, Seymour Town was renamed to Leonard Town, after Governor Benedict Leonard Calvert, the then Governor of Maryland.

Leonardtown is the County Seat of St. Mary's County, and is a municipal government with a population estimated at over 2,000 residents, with many town businesses. A municipal government is one that operates independently and abides by a charter. In the charter, the Town Commissioners are empowered to pass any ordinance necessary to insure the health, safety, protection and welfare of the citizens in Leonardtown. Leonardtown was incorporated in 1858. Incorporation is the act of changing a governmental entity or an unincorporated area into a municipality. Leonardtown is also part of the Maryland Municipal League (MML) and the Southern Maryland Municipal Association (SMMA). Both MML and SMMA are made up of many of the Municipal Governments in the State of Maryland. MML is a voluntary, nonprofit, nonpartisan association controlled and maintained by city and town governments that works to strengthen the role and capacity of municipal government through research, legislation, technical assistance, training and the dissemination of information for its members.
