## TOWN ADMINISTRATOR TRAVELS TO JAPAN

Town Administrator, Laschelle Miller, was selected by the Council of Local Authorities for International Relations (CLAIR) as one of nine candidates from the United States and Canada to participate in a ten-day local government exchange program held in Japan. This exchange and cooperation program took place in November 2006.

Laschelle was nominated by Scott Hancock, Executive Director of the Maryland Municipal League, who participated in the program himself two years ago. Other candidates came from towns and cities of various sizes or from government support organizations. Some of the other participating cities, states and organizations included Santa Paula, California, Dearborn, Michigan, Markham, Canada, State of New Jersey and New Hampshire, National


Governor's Association, National Conference of State Legislatures and the Council of State Governments.

The candidates began their travels with a tour of Little Tokyo in Los Angeles. They then flew directly to Tokyo, Japan where, with representatives from Australia and China, they toured many historic sites and government-related facilities. Japan Government officials met with the group to educate them about the local autonomy system.

The candidates were then flown from Tokyo cross-country to the rural setting of the Shimane Prefecture and Matsue City. For six days they toured and met with various State and City officials and participated in

## Mayor's Message

During the years that I have served as Leonardtown's Mayor I have shared with the residents my goal of revitalization of the Downtown. To achieve this goal a great deal of planning by the Council and staff has been accomplished to ensure that the groundwork has been laid to accommodate the growth in as positive a manner as possible for both new and existing residents.

I am pleased to announce that in November of 2006 Leonardtown was awarded the Outstanding Program Award by the Maryland Chapter of the American Planning Association for the Redevelopment and Revitalization of Downtown Leonardtown. The award recognized the proactive approach the Town has taken to revitalize its downtown and the planning effort it has made to plan for future growth. The Council and I have commissioned a number of studies in the last several years such as the Downtown Plan, Development Design Manual, Downtown Parking Study, Water and Sewer Study, Waterfront Plan and the Planned Infill and Redevelopment District zoning overlay.

Over the last several years Leonardtown has attracted more and more attention at the State level. In 2002 Leonardtown received the Smart Growth Award for Redevelopment and Revitalization from Governor Glendening. In 2005 Leonardtown was named Governor Ehrlich's first Priority Place for the redevelopment of Leonardtown Wharf.

Developers, Engineers and Planners that have worked with the Town in the last several years have commented that Leonardtown's proactive approach to planning for the anticipated growth is a rare and commendable effort. Just walk down the streets of Leonardtown today and you will see the fruits of these efforts paying off for all the businesses and residents of our wonderful, historic town.



## Soap Box Derby





### 2006 Tax Returns

When completing your Maryland Income Tax return, please remember to check the “Municipality” box and write in “Leonardtown”. This does not increase your taxes, but, thanks to you, it does assure that the Town will receive its share of income taxes from the State of Maryland.

### Leonardtown Elections

With the recent institution of the Town Council members serving a four-year term of office, there will not be a Town Election Day in 2007. The next Town Election Day will be in May of 2008, whereupon the Mayor's seat and two Council seats will be voted on. All elected officials of the Town of Leonardtown must be a registered St. Mary's County voter and reside within the incorporated limits of Leonardtown. Potential candidates for the 2008 elections are encouraged to contact the Town Office at 301-475-9791 for additional information.

### Permits Required for Home Repairs

With the upcoming spring and summer seasons, it's customary for residents to check their “to do” lists and make plans for home improvement projects. Town residents should apply for and obtain a building permit at least two weeks before making their new and exciting additions! Building permits are required for sheds, decks, swimming pools, piers, room additions and additional living space. 

The Leonardtown Wharf Park project is progressing nicely. The bulkhead and elevated catwalk are in and the foundation for the public building is completed. You are beginning to





One of the duties of the Mayor and Town Council is to “protect the public health, safety and welfare in residential structures and premises”. To accomplish this goal many local ordinances have been passed over the years. Ordinances regarding property maintenance (including grass, brush and weed maintenance), animal control regulations, trash collection, livability standards, burning, vehicle storage, building construction, and water and sewer are all a part of the Code of the Town of Leonardtown.

### Computer Based Mapping to Begin in Town

The Commissioners of Leonardtown are making preparations to begin computer based mapping of its public utilities and other assets. The Town, with the use of a dedicated computer workstation, GPS receiver, and software purchased through a generous grant from the Department of Homeland Security, plans to establish a GIS (Geographical Information System) for the Town. Its first task will be the mapping and data collection of a fire hydrant system with the assistance of students from the James A. Forrest Career and Technology Center, under instructor Christiana Daley, who are currently enrolled in the GIS elective class. This cooperative effort will hopefully be the start of allowing students to hone their GIS skills in real world conditions while assisting the Town coming into the 21<sup>st</sup> century in asset management. GIS is recognized as the cutting edge in infrastructure management for municipalities and plans for its expansion to cover other areas, such as the water and sewer systems planned for this summer. ## Stopping Illegal Dumping

Each quarter Leonardtown businesses pay their quarterly waste disposal bill just like everyone else. The problem comes when their dumpsters are so full of other people's trash that they can't use what they are paying for. Town staff is working with businesses and Town Deputy, Gray Maloy, to stop illegal dumping. Please do your part and keep your eyes open for anyone illegally dumping trash. Contact the Town office if you have information that will help in stopping this problem.

### Trash Pickup and Recycling Reminders

Residential trash collections are scheduled every Tuesday and Friday. Trash is accepted in 30-gallon cans with lids, cans on wheels, or bagged trash set on the ground. To guarantee collection, trash should be set out the night before or by 6:00 a.m. on the day of pick-up. Bagged leaves set out by Town residents will also be picked up on regularly scheduled collection days, but is limited to 5 bags per household, per collection day.

The 2007 quarterly bulk trash pickup dates are: Wednesday, March 7<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday, June 6<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday, Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>, and Wednesday, Dec. 5<sup>th</sup>.

Residential recycling pickup of old newspapers, glass bottles, jars, metal and aluminum cans, and approved plastic bottles is made on Thursdays.

Waste Management will operate on a regular schedule during the weeks in this quarter having a holiday.

discussions about local government. Many of the problems faced by the local government thousands of miles from here are issues that jurisdictions in the United States are faced with as well. Their population is aging and many of the young people are leaving the country. Meanwhile the financially strapped local government is looking for ways to bring tourists to the area as well as create more attractive jobs for the locals.

During one of the meetings Laschelle presented to Mr. Hidetaka Matsuo, the Vice Governor of Shimane, a Maryland Flag, previously flown over the State House, compliments of Maryland Delegate John Wood. To the Mayor of Matsue City, the host city, Laschelle presented the flag of the Town of Leonardtown with a handwritten note from Leonardtown Mayor J. Harry Norris. Individually, the candidates were welcomed into the homes of Japanese families for a two-day home stay to gain knowledge first hand about Japanese culture. The host families indulged their guests with personalized tours of some of the family's favorite tourist sites, school activities, shopping locations or restaurants of choice.

On the last day of the program, the participants were given a day to freely browse, shop, and experience Tokyo on their own. In summary of the program and trip, Laschelle commented, "I was overwhelmed by how kindly, welcoming and tremendously helpful the Japan Government officials, the CLAIR staff, and the Japanese citizens were.
