

A resolution to amend fee schedule.

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance duly enacted by the Commissioners of Leonardtown on June 12, 1973, a zoning ordinance for the Town of Leonardtown was adopted.

WHEREAS, said zoning ordinance provides among other things for the regulating, control and review of future development within the Town of Leonardtown.

WHEREAS, Article XVIII, Section 155-85 of the zoning ordinance provides that the Town Commissioners shall establish by resolution a schedule of fees, charges, and expenses, and a collection procedure for occupancy permits, building permits, and other matters pertaining to this ordinance.

WHEREAS, the Town Commissioners, upon recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission, adopted a zoning permit fee schedule on February 8, 1982.

WHEREAS, the schedule of fees may be altered, or amended, only by the Town Commissioners after referral to the Planning and Zoning Commission.

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission, based upon its experience regarding the cost and expenses incurred in various matters concerning the ordinance has recommended an amendment to the fee schedule.

WHEREAS, the Town Commissioners have reviewed same and are of the opinion that the charges set forth are fair and equitable.





- Application for Permanent Sign Permit (25¢ per sq. ft. of signage surface, \$10.00 minimum)
- Application for a Temporary Sign Permit \$5.00


