**RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, St. Mary's County is vulnerable to natural hazards such as costal erosion flooding, extreme weather conditions, and wildfires that can result in property loss, loss of life, economic hardship and threats to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Leonardtown adopted the St. Mary's County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan in 2006 by Resolution number 1-06 and;

WHEREAS, the proposed updated St. Mary's County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan recommends mitigation measures that will reduce losses to life and property affected by the natural hazards that face the County; and

WHEREAS, the updated St. Mary's County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan was approved by the Maryland Emergency Management Agency on September 29, 2017 and the Federal Emergency Management Agency on November 21, 2017; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED on this 12<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2018, by the Commissioners of Leonardtown that:

- The St. Mary's County Multi-Jurisdictional Updated Hazard Mitigation Plan is hereby adopted as an official plan of the Town of Leonardtown.
